National Awareness Day for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, and Red Dress Day

May 5th is National Awareness Day for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two Spirit and Gender Diverse People Day (MMIWG). This day is also known as Red Dress Day. Jaime Black of Anishinaabe/Finnish descent presented her REDress art installation where hundreds of red dresses were displayed in public spaces to raise awareness for the more than 1,000 missing Indigenous women. The red dresses are hung to show the “pain and loss of felt by loved ones and survivors”.

The color Red represents the blood connection between people and red is the only colour spirits can see. “The red dresses aid in calling the spirits of missing and murdered women and girls back to their loved ones”.

A red hand has become the symbol for the MMIWG movement and it “stands for all the missing sisters who have no voice”.
